KS2 Curriculum Overview

Summer Term 2023



English

During the term, children will be writing adventure narratives, studying classic fiction and using a picture book as a stimulus for writing. They will also look at pattern poetry - haiku and cinquain. The children will deepen their understanding of grammar with daily challenges. They will learn about different sentence types and how to use them effectively in independent writing. We continue with daily handwriting practice.

Our Reading Ladder challenge continues as we strive to read for 100 hours. Please continue to encourage your child to read daily and bring their reading records into school so they can be entered into the weekly reading raffle.

PSHE

This term we are focusing on the following topics:

- Healthy body and minds.
 - Coping with change.
- Families and committed relationships.

Art

This term children will be learning about sculpture, with a focus on Antony Gormley. As part of our trip to Newcastle, we will visit the Angel of the North.

History

This term children will be learning about Early Islamic Civilisation.

They will find out what Baghdad was like as a city and how the geography of the region impacted upon the lives of everyday people.

They will use map work, sources and independent enquiry to find out how this civilisation ties into our existing knowledge.

Maths

This term in maths, Year 3 and 4 will be covering fractions, decimals, time, shape and money. Y5 will cover shape, position and direction, decimals and converting money. Y6 children will finish preparing for SATs before consolidating on prior learning.

All children will continue to consolidate skills in the 4 operations + -. x and ÷ through daily Question Time. We will continue with daily times table practice for rapid recall, a vital mathematical skill. Times Table Rockstars is a good way to support your child's understanding of their times-tables - they all have their own logins.

D.

Glove Puppets/ Recycling and Repurposing.

The children will research, design, make and evaluate a glove puppet. They will then take a DT learning journey looking at recycling/repurposing to create a bird feeder.

Computing

This term the children will be introduced to the new I-pads and begin their computing journey using Apple computing.

The specific focus question for this term will be 'What do religions say to us when life gets hard." To consolidate on our learning about Hinduism, we will visit a Mandir, in Newcastle.
