We are reading: Stone Age Boy Ask me about: How shadows are formed




Stone Age Challenge. Building a fire with only kindling, cotton wool and a flint and steel. Oak class considered the importance of fire for people in the Stone Age as fire was a source of warmth, a way of cooking their food as well as scaring away predators. Oak Class have been using this knowledge to support them in creating fantastic non-chronological reports on the Stone Age. Well done Oak class for linking your knowledge across so many different subjects.




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Over the past two weeks, Oak class have also been scientists, exploring how we see objects and how and why shadows are formed. We enjoyed exploring how different objects can create different shadows when we change the position and angle of the light source. Oak class were excellent scientists creating thorough predictions and conclusions. We also showed lovely teamwork skills. Well done Oak Class!





Game of Actual Life (G.O.A.L). Oak class were lucky to be introduced to the Game of Actual Life on Monday. Oak class were all trasformed into 22 year olds with bank accounts. They had to make important decisions regarding their lives and money, especially considering what is important to them. Oak class gave fantastic and thoughtful answers to the question: 'What is most important to you - Wealth, Health or Happiness?'. On Monday afternoon, Oak class had the privilege of having Steve from the RAF Lego STEM team join us to show us how to create amazing moon buggy's.



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
