We are reading: Sky Song Ask me about: The colours in French

Last week, we had a lovely visit from the Fire Brigade who were giving us some top tips on how to stay safe in these dark nights! We learnt that we should always 'be bright' when going out in the dark whether that is taking a torch, having lights on your bike and/or wearing reflective materials. We were also given reminders about walking and cycling safely at night as it is important to 'be alert', especially to vehicles in the dark and so we should always walk on the paths and if there is not a path we should walk on the right so we can see oncoming traffic.



Last week, we had an informative visit from a Police officer about knife crime and staying safe. We watched a video and had the opportunity to ask the Police Officer a range of questions about how we can stay safe and how the police can keep us safe.



In Geography we have been learning all about our school and local area. We plotted a route through the school grounds, and used maps and compasses to help us to get to our destination.

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On Friday, we had an amazing afternoon with the recycling hub! We played board games using recycled materials whilst learning the different ways the things we use can be disposed of: bin, compost, recycle or re-use! The children really enjoyed playing the games with one student even wanting to add it to their Christmas wish list!



On Monday we had a wonderful experience at a healthy school educational trip at East Barnby. We took part in a sensory activity first, exploring and learning different herbs and what makes up a balanced diet.



Next was our "Go find it" game, where the children wore pedometers to track their level of activity and learnt they should be doing 10-12,000 steps a day and active for at least an hour.

After a break we went to our third workshop which was led by a group from Compass Phoenix. We did the hula hoop challenge, learnt why resilience is so important and made happiness boxes, where the children were given colouring sheets, fidget toys and bubbles to fill their happy boxes.

Finally our last activity was the campfire, where the children learnt the skill of how to use willow branches to make a dream catcher and toasted marshmallows over the fire!



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The year 5 and 6's took part at athletics at Whitby School. They gave amazing effort in giving everything a go in the first half and brilliant team effort in the second half for the running and relay races. Being the smallest group there, the children showed resilience and determination at the highest form. Well done!



In Science, the year 3's and 4's have been learning about states of matter. In our science lesson last week, we learnt that particles make up everything in the world and they can behave differently in the different states of matter: solids, liquids and gases. We even had a go at behaving like particles in each state of matter!
