We are reading: Our focus in English this fortnight is based on a video called Don't Go. A cartoon alien is being chased by a cat, and we need to write instructions for the alien to avoid being caught!

We have started our Happy Minds in nursery class and introduced ourselves to the characters Betty and Bertie. We shared our story about a play date and encouraging children to have resilience and keep trying.



The children extended the session by small world play with the characters from the story.



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We had a visit from two dental nurses in the Acorns showing us the importance of keeping our teeth clean and healthy.

We took part in several activities and carried on the theme in our provision by role playing, visiting the dentist.



In Maths, Year 1 have been looking at numbers from 11-20 over the last fortnight, we are now combing all our learning, to compare them.



Year 2 have just started a new block of learning on Multiplication and Division, and we have started by looking at equal groups. We have also been working really hard in all our phonics sessions.

As a school, we are always looking at ways to support both families and the wider community. We recently found out about an opportunity for Oakridge to become a hub for a food club called the Bread and Butter thing.
